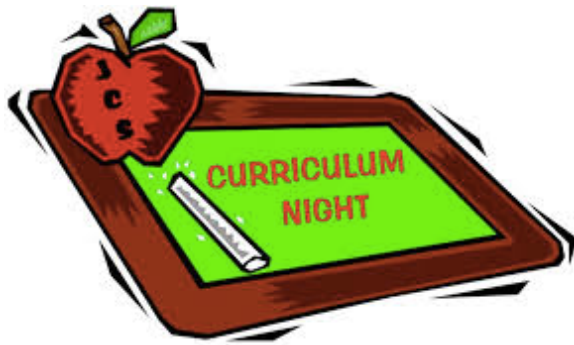


Curriculum Night

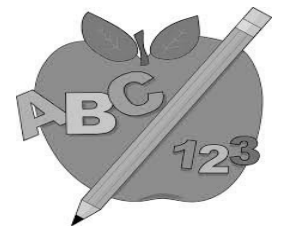
6th/7th Grade "Buddies"

Students were very busy this week! Over dinner or while walking to the subway, be sure to ask your child about what they are learning in school! This week's topics are:

- ❖ Finding the distance between numbers on a number line and addition/subtraction of integers in Ms. O'Brien's 7th grade Math classes
- ❖ Using prime factorization to find the Greatest Common Factors and Least Common Multiples in Ms. Zaiantz's 6th grade Math classes
- ❖ Learning the concept of "context" in Ms. Profeta's 6th grade ELA classes
